

## **Submitting Articles and Cooperating with the Editorial Board of the Scientific Journal "Volga Region Pedagogical Search"**

1. The article should be submitted for publication for the first time and can not be published earlier. The research on which the article is based should be original and new. It is inadmissible to publish false information, as well as plagiarism (signing your own name instead of the author's name or borrowing fragments of other people's works without indicating the source of borrowing). The submitted articles are tested in the "Anti-plagiarism" program.
2. The author undertakes to cooperate with the editorial board of the journal: to make changes, to eliminate errors at the request of the editorial board. In the event of the author's refusal to eliminate errors or inaccuracies found in the text, to determine the concepts used, to increase the volume of annotation, introduction or conclusion, to clarify his idea, to strengthen the reasoning of the allegations, the editorial board reserves the right to reject the material.
3. The author guarantees the correctness of references and citations, the availability of all necessary permits for the results used in the article, facts and other borrowed materials. If the author notices errors in the article already submitted for consideration, he must take measures to correct them as soon as possible.
4. The editorial board of the scientific journal "Volga Region Pedagogical Search" accepts articles that correspond to the topic, and organizes a process of "blind" review. Reviewers assess the scientific level of the material, while the remarks should not concern the personal qualities of the authors or contain insulting comments.
5. The Editorial Board selects articles for publication in the journal and, as a result of peer review and collegial discussion, issues a weighted decision on the rejection or publication of materials.
6. At the request of the author, the decision of the editorial board and the reviews without the indication of the surnames may be sent to him by e-mail.
7. All publications are free for the authors.

### **Requirements for Articles**

The name of the article should include two parts separated by a colon.

The first part can reflect the object of the research, the second should reflect the object.

The abstract is an information source independent of the article, a brief characteristics of the work, including the relevance of the problem, results and conclusions. When writing the abstract, you should pay attention to the following: do not repeat the text of the article itself, do not repeat the information contained in its title; do not include figures, tables, text footnotes, abbreviations, any material that is not mentioned in the article; do not describe the method or methodology of the work thoroughly; do not state the main results of the conducted research extremely accurately and informatively; do not provide factual data; do not use the syntactic constructions inherent in the language of scientific and technical documents, avoid complex grammatical constructions, introductory words, general formulations.

Keywords are basic general scientific terms ordered from the most general to specific, providing the relevant description of the study.

The text of the article should contain the following necessary elements: statement of the problem, goals and aims of the research; original author's research: primary empirical data and their qualitative or quantitative analysis; processing of secondary data; historical research; the analysis of the evolution of scientific views on the chosen topic, etc .; conclusions that are consistent with the goals and objectives of the study.

Articles of undergraduates and postgraduate students must necessarily contain the information about the scientific tutor.

Recommended volume of the article: not less than 8 and not more than 15 pages of the original text (Times New Roman font, font size 14, 1.5 intervals).
